Dear Parents and Carers.

Our first full week in school after Christmas has been as busy as always. We were represented amazingly well by some of our pupils this week at a Dodgeball Competition and a Kinball Event. Both these sporting events were held at other schools in Widnes and Runcorn and our children behaved impeccably and showed kindness, resilience, patience and courage at all times. We are so proud of you all. Reverend Roland was back in sharing his thoughts, music and prayers with us in Collective Worship. Our theme for Worship this half term is perseverance so you may hear or read a lot about this over the next few weeks. In our attempts to return to previous routines following COVID restrictions being lifted, we are changing our PE routines from next week. On PE days, from now on, we need ALL pupils to come into school wearing normal school uniform and bring their PE kits with them. The younger pupils need to build the skills to help them learn to dress and undress themselves and the older pupils need to prepare for High School.

We will use the next couple of weeks to get into the new routine and after that there will be an expectation for these rules to be followed. Anybody who does not bring their kit into school on PE days will get a phone call home to request that one is brought in.

Please remove your child's earrings before they come into school on the days they have PE, as Staff are not allowed to remove or put earrings in for pupils. Newly pierced ears or earrings that cannot be removed for medical reasons (please speak to staff at school if this is the case) must be covered by plasters which staff will NOT put on, so please do this at home before they come into school.

Thank you to you all for continuing to support the school in our attempts to improve attendance and learning opportunities for all our pupils.

Last week whole school attendance was 90.4% which although still some way off our target is significantly better than before Christmas.

Beech class won the best attendance treat. Their attendance of 92.4% won them an extra 10 minutes playtime. Nobody won a star towards their Halebank Attendance Hero reward this week however we are hopeful for next week!
