Part A: Curriculum music

All children are taught by a Music Specialist Teacher (Mrs Andrea Price) weekly for 30 minutes. KS2 participate in weekly 45 minutes sessions of Music and Movement with Early Music as Education (EMAE).

- Our music curriculum is informed by the <u>model music curriculum</u> (March 2021), but linked to other areas of the curriculum, making cross curricular links to enhance children's learning.
- The foundations of our Music lessons are through singing and this begins in Reception. We develop the singing throughout the school and include opportunities to perform, to build confidence in this area. We identify and learn key elements of music and integrate knowledge through our songs. As children progress through school we add harmony into our songs and children maintain independent parts. At the beginning of KS2 all children begin their instrumental journey with whole class recorder. This continues in Year 4 with the addition of some children taking up a woodwind instrument alongside the whole class recorder. In Year 5 all children learn the ukulele and read from notation. At the end of each academic year we have a musical extravaganza, which showcases all of our instrumental work and the finale includes all instruments performing together. Children who learn an instrument also aim to take ABRSM music exams.

• We have loaned woodwind instruments (clarinets and flutes) from our local music hub (Resonate formally Accent) and have the opportunity to participate in hub events and CPD.

Part B: Extra-curricular music

We have small group and 1:1 music tuition in flute and clarinet.

Our music offer outside of music lessons is free of charge for children. Children receiving instrumental tuition are provided with an instrument and a space to rehearse in school, either in small groups or 1:1.

We have an independent music specialist that provides our instrumental tuition and our instruments are on loan from our music hub.

We provide our children with lots of opportunities throughout the year to perform both in and out of school as well as experience live professional performance.
