Covid-19 Update

Following a few new positive cases of the virus within the school community, Public Health have advised us to continue to reduce the mixing of classes as much as possible for another week. We have made the decision to keep these arrangements in place until we break up for Christmas on Wednesday, 22nd December as we think this is the safest and most sensible thing to do. Thank you for supporting us in our work to reduce the spread of the virus within the school community.

At this stage in the term, we are experiencing an increase in general illness and we are all feeling a little more cautious than normal. Our advice to you is to continue to look out for the three main symptoms of Covid 19: a high temperature, a new, continuous cough and a loss or change to the sense of smell or taste. If your child develops any of these, he/she should **isolate** and **arrange a PCR test**. If you require any support or advice in relation to symptoms or testing, please contact the school office and staff will be happy to talk to you. When you receive your child's PCR result, please phone the school office as soon as possible and forward the result (via email) to Mrs Fenlon at sec.halebank@halton.gov.uk. Thank you.
