Dear Parents and Carers

It's nearly two weeks since I last wrote to you and it now feels like an awfully long time ago that we were all in school together. I hope that you are all keeping yourselves busy and that everyone is in good health. As we approach the end of the second week of official school closures, there are a few items that I would like to draw your attention to.

Launch of Voucher Scheme for Schools Providing Free School Meals

Earlier in the week, the government announced a national voucher scheme to enable pupils who would usually receive free school meals to continue to access meals while schools are closed. While we did offer you the option of collecting packed lunches from school if your child is eligible, the take up of this has been extremely low.

The new voucher scheme is only available during term time so we will look to have this up and running for eligible families during the week beginning Monday, 20th April. If your child is currently in receipt of free school meals, the school will complete the registration process and once this has been done, you will be emailed an 'eCode' to enable you to access your vouchers electronically. Mrs Fenlon has already sent out a text reminder asking you for your current email address. Please respond to this text as soon as you can to enable us to get you set up for the voucher scheme. Once received, the vouchers can be spent on food at a range of shops including Sainsbury's, Tesco, Asda, Morrisons and M&S. The Department for Education is working to get more shops to join the scheme as soon as possible. The press release relating to the voucher scheme can be found here.

Please note that the scheme supports families whose children receive benefit/incomerelated free school meals (not the universal infant free school meals that all pupils in Classes 1 and 2 have each day). If you are unsure about whether your child is eligible for free school meals, please have a look at the information on Halton Borough Council's website. While the voucher scheme is being set up, daily packed lunches can still be ordered and collected from the school kitchen. Please email Mrs Fenlon if you would like to arrange this provision for your child.

Childcare Provision

The school's childcare facility will continue to run throughout the Easter break for pupils whose parents are 'key workers' and for vulnerable children. If you are using the service, please continue to confirm your child's attendance by 5.00 pm the day before by emailing me and Mrs Fenlon at head.halebank@halton.gov.uk and sec.halebank@halton.gov.uk. Thank you.

Good Friday and Easter Monday

The general consensus across schools in Halton is that settings will try to stay open for the children of key workers on Good Friday and Easter Monday where this is possible. In order to allow our staff some time with their own families over the Easter weekend, I would be grateful if you could inform Mrs Fenlon as soon as possible if your work is 'critical to the COVID-19 response' and you require childcare on the bank holidays.
